4. By passing the order on 21/11/2022, this Court has protected the present applicants in criminal

application (ABA) No. 808/2022, considering the case-diary was not before the Court.

5. After perusal of the matter, this Court comes to the conclusion that there is prima-facie material against the present applicant(s) and the application is rejected. However, considering the fact that the applicant(s) were initially protected by this Court and they have to decide the further action. No prejudice will be caused to the otherside by protecting the present applicant(s) for two weeks’.

6. Hence, the interim order protecting the present applicant(s) continue for two weeks.
