This Petition has been filed to condone the delay of 1582 days in filing the above Civil Miscellaneous appeal against the Judgment and Decree made in MCOP.No.682 of 2013 dated 28.02.2018 on the file of the Motor Accidents Claims Tribunal (Chief Judicial Magistrate, Coimbatore).

2. Heard the learned counsel for the Appellant/Insurance Company and Mr.Sharath Chandran, learned counsel for the 1st respondent.
