ORDER

The Criminal Original Petition has been filed to quash the FIR in Crime No. 922 of 2021, pending on the file of the 1st respondent.

2. The case is still at the stage of investigation. the parties have decided to bury their hatchet and compromise the dispute amicably among themselves.

3. The Joint Memo of Compromise has been filed before this Court which have been signed by the petitioners and the defacto complainant and also by their respective counsel. The petitioners and the second respondent were also present in person before this Court and they were identified by Mr.V.Chandra sekar, SSI, B-1 North Beach Police Station, Flower Bazaar, Chennai. In the joint compromise memo, it has been stated that the petitioners and the second respondent had entered into a



compromise and amicably settled their issues in Crime No.922 of 2021.

This Court also enquired both the parties and was satisfied that the parties have come to an amicable settlement between themselves.

4. Under such circumstances, no useful purpose will be served in keeping the First Information Report pending, even though, the offences involved are not compoundable in nature. In the light of the guidelines given by the Hon'ble Supreme Court reported in **2017 9 SCC 641- (Parbathbhai Aahir @ Parbathbhai Vs. State of Gujrath)**, and after exercising due caution as advised by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **The State of Madhya Pradesh v. Dhruv Gurjar and Another** reported in **(2019) 2 MLJ CrI 10**, this Court in exercise of its jurisdiction under Section 482 Cr.P.C. quashes the First Information Report in Crime No.922 of 2021, on the file of the 1st respondent Police.

5. This Criminal Original Petition stands allowed and as a sequel, the proceedings in Crime No.922 of 2021, on the file of the 1st respondent police, is quashed and the terms of affidavit shall form part and parcel of this order.



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Each petitioner shall pay a sum of Rs.500/- (Rupees five hundred only) as costs, to the credit of the **President, Tamil Nadu Advocates Clerk Association, Salem (Indian Overseas Bank, District Court Branch, Salem 7, A/c No.178001000000397, IFSC Code:IOBA0001780)** within a period of one week from the date of receipt of a copy of this order and file a photocopy of the receipt along with a memo reporting compliance in the Registry.

6. Post this case under the caption for reporting compliance on 21.09.2023.
