ORDER

**The Criminal Original Petition has been filed to quash the F.I.R in
Crime No.290 of 2022, pending on the file of the first respondent.**



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2. The case is still at the stage of investigation. The parties have decided to bury their hatchet and compromise the dispute amicably among themselves.

3. The affidavit, dated 20.09.2023 of the second respondent / de-facto complainant has been filed before this Court. The parties are present in person before this Court. They are identified by Mr.Sakthi, Sub-Inspector of Police, Guduvanchery Police Station, Chengalpattu. In the affidavit, it has been stated that the petitioner and the second respondent had entered into a compromise and amicably settled their issues in Crime No.290 of 2022. This Court also enquired both the parties and was satisfied that the parties have come to an amicable settlement between themselves.

4. Under such circumstances, no useful purpose will be served in keeping the First Information Report pending, even though, the offences involved are not compoundable in nature. In the light of the guidelines given by the Hon'ble Supreme Court reported in **(2017) 9 SCC 641 - (Parbathbhai Aahir @ Parbathbhai Vs. State of Gujrath)**, and after



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exercising due caution as advised by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in *The State of Madhya Pradesh Vs. Dhruv Gurjar and Another* reported in (2019) 2 MLJ Crl 10, this Court in exercise of its jurisdiction under Section 482 of Cr.P.C., quashes the First Information Report in Crime No.290 of 2022, on the file of the first respondent Police.

5. This Criminal Original Petition stands allowed and as a sequel, the proceedings in Crime No.290 of 2022, on the file of the first respondent Police, is quashed in entirety and the terms of affidavit of the second respondent / de-facto complainant shall form part and parcel of this order. The petitioners shall pay a sum of Rs.2500/- (Rupees Two thousand five hundred only) as costs, to the credit of the Chairman, Advocate Clerks Association, Tirupattur, Vellore District (Indian Bank, Kacheri Street Branch, Tirupattur A/c No.485403938, IFSC Code:IDIB00T039), within a period of two weeks from today and file a photocopy of the receipt along with a memo reporting compliance in the Registry. Consequently, connected miscellaneous petition is closed.
