



Crl.O.P.No.24094 of 2023

The petitioner herein seeks anticipatory bail in Crime No.0185 of 2023 registered by the respondent Police for the offence under Sections 294(b), 325, 506(ii) IPC.

2. The learned counsel for the petitioner stated that the petitioner is an innocent person and he has been falsely implicated in Crime No.0185 of 2023 registered by the respondent Police for the offence under Sections 294(b), 325, 506(ii) IPC. Thus, he seeks anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

3. It is stated by the learned Government Advocate (Crl.Side) submitted that the defacto complainant had parked the two wheeler in front of the shop of the petitioner, who is running sweet & snacks shop. It led to quarrel between them and escalated into assault. It is stated that the defacto complainant suffered injuries which requires two plates to be inserted. Thus, he prayed for dismissal of this petition.



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[c] the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

[d] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560]**;

[f] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229A IPC;
