



Crl.O.P.No.24821 of 2023

The petitioner/A1, who apprehends arrest for the alleged offences punishable under Section 381 IPC, subsequently altered to Sections 120 (b) r/w Sections 381 and 411 IPC, in Crime No.1701 of 2023, on the file of the respondent police, seeks anticipatory bail.

2.Heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and the learned Government Advocate (Crl.Side) on behalf of the respondent.

3.It is stated that the petitioner herein is working under the defacto complainant in Srinivasa clothing company. It is the grievance of the defacto complainant that 500 Kgs of cloth material was lost and it is stated that the petitioner and other two accused had taken it away and diverted it to another company.

4.The learned counsel for the petitioner states that the value of the material so far as the petitioner is concerned is Rs.3,25,000/-. The second and third accused had been taken into custody and they are still in custody. However, stolen property had been recovered.



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5.In view of that particular fact and the fact that the petitioner has no previous antecedents, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner with certain conditions.

6.Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on his appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date on which the order copy made ready, before the **learned Judicial Magistrate No.1, Tiruppur**, on condition that the petitioner shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent police or the police officer, who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail shall stand dismissed and on further condition that:

[a] the petitioner and the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity.



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[b] the petitioner shall report before the respondent Police, daily morning at 10.00 a.m.,until further orders.

[c] the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

[d] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560]**;

[f] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229A IPC;

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
