PRAYER: Writ Petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India, praying this Court to issue a Writ of Mandamus, directing the respondents to grant permission to perform the programme of Adal Padal on 01.04.2023 at about 6.00 pm to 11.00 pm at Thiruvaiyaru Taluk, Veerasingam Pettia, Arulmigu Sri Maari Amman Kovil Temple, Thanjavur District and to provide adequate police protection based on the representation,, dated 29.03.2023.

ORDER

This writ petitioner filed this Writ Petition seeking for issuance of a Writ of Mandamus directing the respondents, directing the respondents to permit the petitioner to conduct “Adal Padal” program at Thiruvaiyaru Taluk, Veerasingam Pettai in Arulmigu Sri Maari Amman Kovil Temple, Thanjavur District, on 01.04.2023 from 6.00 pm to 11.00 pm and to provide adequate police protection.

2. Mr R.Sureshkumar, learned Government Advocate (Crl. Side) takes notice for the respondents. By consent, this writ petition is taken up for final disposal at the admission stage itself.

3. The learned counsel appearing for the writ petitioner submitted that festival for the temple, by name, “Arulmigu Sri Maari Amman Kovil Temple situated at Thiruvaiyaru Taluk, Veerasingam Pettai, Thanjavur District, is going to be held on 01.04.2023. Subsequent to the same, in order to conduct a cultural programme on 01.04.2023 from 06.00 p.m. to 11.00 pm, they sought permission of the police by giving a representation dated 29.03.2023. But, the second respondent has not

considered the said representation. Since no order was passed, the writ petitioner has come before this Court for the above said relief.

4. The learned Government Advocate (Crl. Side) appearing for the respondents would submit that the second respondent has received the representation of the writ petitioner and the same is pending for consideration.

5. I have considered the submission of the learned counsel appearing for the writ petitioner and the learned Government Advocate (Crl. Side) appearing for the respondents.

6. It is brought to the notice of this Court that the Director General of Police, Tamil Nadu, Chennai had issued a circular memorandum in Rc. 007301/Genl.I (1)/2019, dated 09.04.2019, along with instructions to the Inspectors of Police throughout Tamil Nadu for consideration of applications seeking permission for conducting cultural programme. Therefore, in view of the detailed circular and guidelines issued by the Director General of Police, the second respondent is hereby directed to consider the representation of the writ petitioner, dated 29.03.2023 and pass suitable orders based on the above said circular.

7. With the above direction, this Writ Petition stands disposed of.
