PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.438 of Cr.P.C

PRAYER :-

For Anticipatory Bail in Crime No.36/2023 on the file of the respondent police.

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioner/ Sole Accused, apprehending arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the alleged offence punishable under Sections 294(b), 323, 324 and 506(ii) of IPC in Crime No.36 of 2023 on the file of the respondent police, seek



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2. The case of the prosecution is that since the defacto complainant is an illiterate, she asked the petitioner to count her money to a sum of Rs.5,000/-. On 06.07.2023, when the defacto complainant returned home after work, she found that Rs.3,000/- was missing. She suspected the petitioner and enquired about the same. There arose a wordy quarrel and the petitioner attacked the defacto complainant with wooden stick. The defacto complainant sustained injuries and admitted in the hospital. Hence the complaint.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is innocent and a false case was foisted against her. Hence, prays to release her on anticipatory bail.

4. The learned Additional Public Prosecutor would submit that it is a dispute between the neighbours and injury sustained by the defacto complainant is only simple in nature.

5. Considering the fact that it is a issue between the neighbours over counting of money and the injury sustained by the defacto complainant is only simple in nature, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner with certain conditions.

6. Accordingly, this Criminal Original Petition is allowed and the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance, before the



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the petitioner shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) each with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and the petitioners shall appear before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m. until further orders. The petitioner shall comply with the condition stipulated under Section 438 Cr.P.C. scrupulously.

7. The petitioner shall appear before the concerned Magistrate within a period of 15 days from the date on which the order copy made ready, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail stands dismissed.
