ORDER

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This criminal original petition has been filed seeking to quash the entire proceedings in CC No.1255 of 2022 on the file of the Judicial Magistrate No.6, Madurai.

2.The contention of the petitioners is that based on the complaint lodged by the 2nd respondent, the 1st respondent registered the First Information Report in Crime No.965 of 2021 for the offences punishable under Sections 294(b), 324 and 506(i) IPC and section 4 of the Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Harassment of Woman Act, 2002 r/w section 34 IPC and it was taken cognizance in CC No.1255 of 2022 by the Judicial Magistrate No.6, Madurai.

3.The further contention of the petitioners is that they compromised the issue with the 2nd respondent amicably. A joint memo of compromise was filed, which has been duly signed by the petitioners and the 2nd respondent and also by their respective counsels.

4.The petitioners and the 2nd respondent appeared before this Court along with their counsels and also produced their Aadhar cards. They were also identified by the learned Government Advocate (Criminal side)

and the Investigation Officer. Both the parties were enquired by me and they accepted the terms of compromise. Hence, the Compromise Memo is recorded.

5.Considering the totality of the circumstances, the nature of the allegations levelled against the petitioners and also in view of the joint compromise memo entered into between the parties, this Court is of the opinion that no useful purpose will be served by keeping the matter pending and inclined to quash entire proceedings in CC No.1255 of 2022 pending on the file of the Judicial Magistrate No.6, Madurai, in respect of the petitioners.

6.In the result, the Criminal Original Petition stands allowed and the entire proceedings in CC No.1255 of 2022 on the file of the Judicial Magistrate No.6, Madurai, is hereby quashed. The compromise memo is recorded and the terms of joint compromise memo shall form part of this order.
