**ORDER:**

**Heard learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioners, learned Government Pleader for Animal Husbandry appearing on behalf of respondent No.1 and Mr Aka Venkataramana, learned standing counsel appearing on behalf of respondent Nos.2 & 3.**

**2. The petitioners approached the Court seeking prayer as under:**

4. Recording the submission of learned standing counsel appearing on behalf of the respondent-university, the Writ Petition is dismissed as infructuous. However, there shall be no order as to costs.

As a sequel, the miscellaneous petitions, if any, pending in the Writ Petition shall also stand closed.

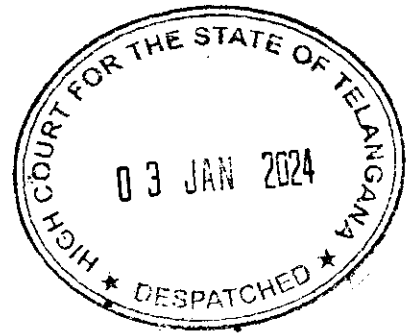
