DEEPAK GUPTA, J. (Oral)

1. On 31.10.2023, the following order was passed by this
Court:-

*“Reply by way of affidavit dated 11.07.2023 of Shri
Devinder Kumar, Deputy Superintendent of Police, Sub
Division Nabha, District Patiala, has already been filed.*

*The allegations against the petitioner is that he
allured numerous people including the complainant to
deposit money in the name of P.R. Business Solutions.*

*Contention of learned counsel for the petitioner is that
petitioner himself is a victim as money was deposited in the
account of the company. Learned counsel further submits
that neither the company has been named as accused nor
any of associate with the company has been arrested so far.*

*Learned State counsel submits that in fact it is the
petitioner, who was given money by the poor people and as
per the allegations, petitioner invested that money in the
company and it is only after interrogation of the petitioner, it
can be known as to where the money was deposited by*

him.

Adjourned to 13.12.2023.

In the meantime, petitioner is directed to join investigation and co-operate in the same. He will not leave the country without prior permission of the Court nor shall make any attempt to contact the complainant of the case or any witness associated with the case. In the event of the arrest of the petitioner, he shall be released on interim bail on his furnishing personal/surety bonds to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer/Investigating Officer. He shall also abide by conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.”

2. Today, on instructions from ASI Gurmeet Singh, learned State counsel has informed this Court that the petitioner has joined the investigation, in compliance of the order dated 31.10.2023 and is no longer required for further investigation.

3. In view of the aforesaid, the order dated 31.10.2023, whereby the petitioner was granted interim anticipatory bail, is hereby made absolute. However, he shall continue to join investigation, if and so required by the Investigating Officer.

4. Pending application, if any, shall stand disposed of.
