Learned State counsel, on the basis of the affidavit of the Superintendent of Police, Jind, dated 06.01.2017, submits that on 14.09.2016, the parties have come present before the SHO, Police Station City Jind and a compromise, by way of an undertaking, has been executed between them and they have assured to maintain the *status quo* till the final

decision by this Court.

These petitions are pending since 2014 and 2016, respectively and subsequent to filing of the aforesaid affidavit by the Superintendent of Police, Jind, there is nothing on record to suggest that aforesaid compromise between the parties was violated by any of the parties.

In view of the same, the present petitions are disposed of.

The parties are granted liberty to file a fresh petition, if so required.
