Prayer in the present petition is for grant of interim bail to the petitioner in a case FIR No.151 dated 03.12.2022, registered under Sections 22 and 29 of the NDPS Act, 1985, at Police Station Sadar Ahmedgarh, District Malerkotla (earlier District Sangrur) on account of his ill health.

This Court vide order dated 16.01.2023, directed the State to file status report and the same has been filed by way of affidavit of Davinder Singh, PPS, DSP PBI, NDPS-cum-Narcotics, Malerkotla additional charge as DSP, Sub Division Ahmedgarh, District Malerkotla, which is taken on record.

Learned State counsel has drawn the attention of this Court to the status report filed, wherein, the petitioner was medically examined and report in this regard is reproduced as under:-

“That the above mentioned UT Ashu son of Barjinder Kumar R/o Shivpuri Chownk, Enclave Basant Vihar Colony, Ludhiana is under our Jail.

He has complained of pain and discomfort in his left leg on 15.01.2023, for which he was referred to the ortho department of Civil Hospital, Malerkotla for X-ray examination and further expert opinion and treatment.

His treatment from Civil Hospital, Malerkotla is continued since January 16, 2023.

He is not having any life threatening disease as of now.

He will be again referred to the ortho department of Civil Hospital, Malerkotla, if required and from there, if they need it required can be further referred to some other higher Centre e.g. Civil Hospital Sangrur or Rajindra Hospital, Patiala for further treatment.”

After hearing learned counsel for the parties and perusing he record, the Court is satisfied that as mentioned in the report, the petitioner is not having any life threatening disease and it is also undertaken by the State that the petitioner would be provided medical attention as and when required and he would be further referred to some other higher Centre e.g. Civil Hospital, Sangrur or Rajindra Hospital, Patiala for further treatment in case of need.

In these circumstances, no ground for interim bail of the petitioner is made out. However, the State is directed to keep on monitoring the health of the petitioner and provide him treatment as per opinion of the Doctors.
