While issuing notice of motion on 17.01.2023, following
order was passed:-

“Present petition has been filed under Section 438 of Cr.P.C., praying for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners in case bearing FIR No. 678 dated 12.12.2022 under Sections 323, 506 and 34 of the Indian Penal Code and Section 25 of Arms Act at Police Station City Narnaul, District Mohindergarh.

Learned counsel for the petitioners contends that petitioners are not named in the FIR and no specific role of the petitioners is attributed in the FIR. It is submitted that co-accused Vinod Kumar Saini has been granted regular bail vide order dated 19.12.2022 passed by the trial Court. Learned counsel further submits that no custodial interrogation of the petitioners is required as nothing is to be recovered from them and they are ready to join the investigation.

Notice of motion.

Mr. Bhupender Singh, DAG Haryana, who is present in the Court, accepts notice on the asking of the Court and could not dispute the fact co-accused Vinod Kumar Saini has been granted regular bail by the trial Court.

Adjourned to 13.04.2023.

Meanwhile, in the event of arrest, the petitioners are ordered to be released on interim bail on their furnishing personal bonds and surety bonds to the satisfaction of Arresting/Investigating Officer. However, the petitioners shall join the investigation as and when called upon to do so and shall abide by the conditions as provided under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.”

2. Today, learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Davinder Singh, has stated that pursuant to the order dated 17.01.2023, the petitioners have joined investigation and are no longer required for custodial interrogation.
3. In view of above, the interim order dated 17.01.2023 passed by this Court is made absolute, subject to the conditions as enumerated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.
4. Petition stands disposed off.
