The petitioners, through instant petition under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India, are seeking direction to respondent Nos.1 to 3 to re-issue passport to the petitioners.

Learned counsel for the petitioners *inter alia* contends that applications of the petitioners seeking issuance passport are pending since December' 2022. The petitioners are minor and there is no reason to keep issuance of passport in abeyance.

Ms. Sharma, learned counsel for the respondents submits that as per her instructions, respondent-passport authority has already completed all the formalities, however, report of S.S.P, Jalandhar is awaited and passport would be issued as soon as report is received from jurisdictional S.S.P.

In view of statement of learned counsel for the respondents, the present petition stands disposed of with a direction to the respondents to complete formalities and decide application of the petitioners seeking passport within 6 weeks from today.
