Nurpur in favour of the petitioner and the petitioner is the rightful owner of the truck. Learned counsel for the petitioner further submits that the petitioner is in custody since 03.01.2023 and the investigation of the case is not complete. He prays for bail.

On the other hand, learned State counsel on instructions from ASI Pardeep Sharma opposes the prayer made by the learned counsel for the petitioner. Learned State counsel has referred to the reply filed by the State and submits that during investigation it transpired that the petitioner is into purchasing of stolen vehicles and tampering with the chassis number and also makes some other modifications in order to change its look. It is further submitted that the matter is under investigation and the truck has been sent to FSL for examination report of which is still awaited.

Considering the above background, the custody of the petitioner and the fact that the investigation is still pending and the FSL report is also awaited, the trial, if any, would take considerable time to commence, further detention of the petitioner may not be necessary for any useful purpose.

Resultantly, without meaning any expression of opinion on the merits of the case, it is ordered that the petitioner be released on regular bail in the above case, subject to his furnishing requisite bail bonds/ surety bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court concerned.

The petition is allowed.
