The petitioner has filed the present petition under Section 438 Cr.P.C. with a prayer to grant anticipatory bail to him in case FIR No.19 dated 31.03.2021, registered under Sections 66-C, 66-D of the Information Technology Act, 2000 and Sections 420 and 120-B of IPC, at Police Station Punjab State Cyber Crime, SAS Nagar.

Vide order dated 09.08.2023, with the consent of the parties, the matter was referred to Mediation and Conciliation Centre of this Court.

Today, learned counsel for the parties have informed the Court that the matter has been amicably resolved between the parties and the settlement deed/agreement dated 05.10.2023 has been signed by the parties.

Learned counsel for the parties, on instructions from their respective clients, submit that they shall remain bound by the terms of the settlement/agreement dated 05.10.2023.

Learned State counsel also submits that the petitioner has joined the investigation and is no longer required for further investigation.

In view of the statement made by learned State counsel, the present petition is allowed and the interim order dated 31.05.2023, passed by a co-ordinate Bench of this Court, is made absolute. The petitioner shall continue to join investigation, as and when called by the Investigating Officer and shall also abide by the conditions as provided under Section 438(2) of the Cr.P.C.
