SUVIR SEHGAL J. (ORAL)

Petitioner has approached this Court under Article 226/227 of Constitution of India seeking issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus for directing the respondents to step up his pay at par with that of his junior.

Counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner has retired from the post of “Dental Mechanic”. By making a reference to averments made in Para 03 of the writ petition, counsel submits that Rajbir Singh, his junior has been drawing higher salary and despite having submitted a legal notice dated 20.02.2021, Annexure P-2, the disparity has not been removed. Counsel submit that the petitioner would be satisfied, in case, a direction is issued to the official respondents to look into the legal notice, Annexure P-2.

Notice of motion.

On asking of the Court, Mr. R.K.S. Brar, Addl. A.G., Haryana, accepts notice on behalf of the respondents.

Given the nature of order being passed, this Court does not deem it necessary to call for a response from the respondents.

Without commenting upon the claim raised in the writ petition or in the legal notice, writ petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.2 to examine the legal notice, Annexure P-2, within a period of 04 months from the date of communication of this order. In case, respondent No.2 finds that the petitioner is not entitled to the benefits claimed, an order assigning reasons be passed within aforesaid period.
