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**VIKAS BAHL, J. (ORAL)**

1. This is a Civil Writ Petition filed under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ, order or direction in the nature of mandamus directing the official respondents to carry out necessary repairs in the house allotted to the petitioner to prevent further leakage of water.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that although, the respondents had carried out some repairs in the door but had not replaced the said door, on account of which, the problem is still persisting.

3. Learned counsel for respondent Nos.1 to 4, on instructions from Mr. S.S. Grewal, XEN, CP Division No.4, UT Chandigarh, has

submitted that the main entrance door would be replaced with a new door within a period of two weeks from today and every endeavour would be made to rectify the defect of seepage, if any.

4. Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that in view of the abovesaid statement made by learned counsel for respondent Nos.1 to 4, the present Civil Writ petition has been rendered infructuous and same may kindly be disposed of as such. It is however prayed that respondent Nos.1 to 4 be bound by the abovesaid statement.

5. Keeping in view the abovesaid facts and circumstances, the present Civil Writ Petition is disposed of as having been rendered infructuous.

6. Respondent Nos.1 to 4 would be bound by the abovesaid statement.
