1. Present writ petition has been filed under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ, order or direction especially in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to award additional 4 marks for his B.A. Degree qualification acquired by him before the closing date of the Advertisement No.4/2020 dated 30.12.2020 (Annexure P-4) before finalizing the final merit for the post of Male Constable (General Duty).

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that for the grievances of the petitioner, a detailed representation dated 20.01.2022 (Annexure P-17) has been given to the respondents including respondent No.3 and has submitted that the petitioner would be satisfied, at this stage, in case respondent No.3 considers the said representation in accordance with law as expeditiously as possible and in case the pleas

raised by the petitioner are found to be meritorious, then, to grant him appropriate relief.

3. Learned State counsel appearing for the respondents has submitted that respondent No.3 would take a final decision on the representation dated 20.01.2022 (Annexure P-17), in accordance with law and the same would be done within a period of three months from the date of certified copy of this order.

4. Keeping in view the above-said facts and circumstances, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.3 to take a final decision on the representation dated 20.01.2022 (Annexure P-17) within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order and in case respondent No.3 is of the view that the pleas raised by the petitioner are meritorious, then, the necessary relief be granted to the petitioner as expeditiously as possible and in case, respondent No.3 is of the view that the pleas raised by the petitioner are meritless, then, a speaking order rejecting the claim be passed within the aforesaid period of three months.

5. It is made clear that this Court has not opined on the merits of the case and respondent No.3 would consider and decide the matter independently, in accordance with law.
