1. All the three petitions are taken up together for final disposal with the consent of learned counsel for the parties since all the three petitions arise out of the same FIR, in which prayer is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

2. At the outset, learned counsel for the complainant has submitted that he has been recently engaged in the present case and has filed his memo of appearance for today with no objection from the counsel earlier representing the complainant and the same is taken on record.

3. Learned counsel for all the petitioners as well as learned counsel for the complainant have submitted that the matter has now been fully settled between the parties. They further submitted that House No.141, Second Floor, Wadhawa Nagar, Dhakoli, Zirakpur has already been transferred by Shweta (petitioner in CRM-M-9219-2023) through GPA to the complainant. They further submitted that the order passed by this Court on 21.02.2023 has already been complied with.

4. On the other hand, learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Nathi Ram, has submitted that in pursuance of the orders passed by this Court on 21.02.2023, the petitioners have already joined investigation and they are

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fully cooperating with the investigation process and they are not required for custodial interrogation.

5. In view of the aforesaid factual position, all the three petitions are allowed. The petitioners shall join the investigation and cooperate fully with the investigation process, in case so required by the Investigating Officer and cooperate accordingly and comply with the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.
