This is a civil writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ in the nature of certiorari for quashing of notice dated 16.02.2023 (Annexure P-4) issued by respondents no.2 and 3 whereby the petitioner has been required to vacate the premises occupied by the petitioner.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that keeping in view the orders passed in the contempt petition, the petitioner seeks to withdraw the present petition but states that since certain articles including computers etc. belonging to the petitioner are lying there and he has been doing his business since the last 30 years, thus, time uptill 15.03.2023 be granted to the petitioner to vacate the area and to remove his belongings. It is further submitted that after vacating the place, the petitioner will report to

Keeping in view the above said facts and circumstances, the present petition is dismissed as withdrawn.

The petitioner is granted time till 15.03.2023 to vacate the place which is occupied by him and to remove his belongings and also to inform respondent no.2 after vacating the same, up till 15.03.2023.

In case the petitioner does not vacate the place uptill 15.03.2023, it would be open to the respondents to use police force to get the said place vacated.
