Reply dated 05.07.2023 by way of affidavit of Deputy Superintendent, District Jail, Gurugram, has been filed, in Court today, and the same is taken on record.

2. This is a criminal writ petition that has been filed seeking grant of parole/interim bail for a period of three weeks in order to perform the last religious rituals of his younger brother who expired on 16.01.2023.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner herein would contend that there is no other major male member in the family who can perform these last rites. It is contended that the father of the petitioner and of the deceased has already expired whereas their mother is aged 62 years old. It is submitted that the final immersion in the Holy Ganga Ji has not taken place as on date.

4. Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the respondents-State

would rely on the status report, as filed, which he would argue that the petitioner herein is facing trial in several pending cases, the details of which have been enumerated in the status report and therefore he cannot be allowed the relief as sought.

5. We have heard the learned counsel for the parties and have also perused the status report as filed in Court today. The petitioner though faced several FIRs but stands acquitted as well in five of the cases that were registered against him. He is on bail in two other matters i.e. FIR No. 158 of 2020 under Section 42(A) Prisons Act, registered at P.S. Bhondsi and FIR No.15 dated 12.01.2020, under Section 195-A, 506 IPC 2 PC Act, registered at Police Station Badshahpur.

6. Since there is no major male member to complete the last rites, the petitioner herein is allowed interim bail of five days to complete the religious formalities and he be released forthwith on furnishing of necessary bail bonds/surety bonds to the satisfaction of the Chief Judicial Magistrate/Duty Magistrate concerned and will surrender five days thereafter on his release.

7. The petition is disposed of accordingly.
