1. This is an application under Section 151 CPC for taking up and deciding CM-9594-CWP-2022 filed for impleading legal representatives of the petitioner and CM-13363-CWP-2019 filed for withdrawal of the present writ petition.

2. It has been jointly prayed by learned counsel for the applicant-petitioner and also by learned counsel for LRs of contesting respondent No.2 that the said applications be allowed and the same be taken up for hearing today itself, inasmuch as, the main writ petition is also to be withdrawn.

3. Learned State counsel has submitted that the respondent-State has no objection in case the said applications as well as the main writ petition are taken up for hearing today itself.

4. Keeping in view the above, the present application is allowed and CM-9594-CWP-2022 filed for impleading legal representatives of the petitioner and CM-13363-CWP-2019 filed for withdrawal of the main writ petition are taken up for hearing today itself.

CM-9594-CWP-2022

1. Present application has been filed under Order 22 Rule 3 read with Section 151 CPC for impleading the legal heirs of petitioner Amro (since deceased) in the above noted writ petition.

2. For the reasons mentioned in the application, which is duly supported by an affidavit, the same is allowed and accordingly, legal representatives of the petitioner, as mentioned in para No.4 of the present application, are ordered to be impleaded as legal representatives of the petitioner, subject to all just exceptions.

**CM-13363-CWP-2019 in/and
CWP-4414-1999 (O&M)**

1. Present application has been filed under Section 151 CPC seeking permission to withdraw the main writ petition.

2. Learned counsel for the applicant-petitioner as well as learned counsel appearing for LRs of contesting respondent No.2 have jointly submitted that the present main writ petition was filed under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India for the issuance of a writ in

the nature of certiorari for quashing of order dated 26.03.1998 (Annexure P-5) passed by respondent No.1 and during the pendency of the present writ petition, a settlement has taken place between the parties and thus, the applicant/LRs of the petitioner do not wish to pursue the present writ petition and have thus, prayed that they be permitted to withdraw the present writ petition.

3. In view of the above-said facts as well as the reasons mentioned in the present application bearing CM-13363-CWP-2019, which is duly supported by an affidavit, the same is allowed and the applicant/LRs of petitioner are permitted to withdraw the present writ petition.

4. In view of the above, the main writ petition is dismissed as withdrawn, as prayed for.
