1. Instant petition has been filed under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 seeking grant of post-arrest bail in:-

FIR No.	Dated	Police Station	Sections
0051	17.06.2021	Sadiq, Tehsil and District Faridkot	22(c) of the NDPS Act (Section 29 of the NDPS Act and Sections 420, 467, 468 and 471, IPC were added later on)

2. Custody Certificate dated 29.11.2023 has been filed by the State, which is taken on record.

3. Upon instructions received from ASI, Boota Singh, State counsel submits that 1,80,000 intoxicating tablets, containing salt Tramadol, have been recovered from a cavity in a truck, which was being driven by Jagroop Singh (petitioner in CRM-M-36788-2021) and the other two occupants of the truck were Rupinder Singh, present petitioner and Gurmeet Singh was the third occupant. As per his instructions, the total weight of the contraband is 64 kg. He has filed short reply by way of an affidavit of Deputy Superintendent of Police, Sub Division, Faridkot in CRM-M-36788-2021, which has been taken on record and submits that Jagroop Singh is named as an accused in two more FIRs, although the antecedents of the petitioner are clean.

4. After addressing for some time, counsel for the petitioner seeks and is granted permission to withdraw the petition.

5. Dismissed as withdrawn.
