MAIN CASE

Present petition has been filed under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 (*for short 'Cr.P.C.'*) for quashing of order dated 30.12.2021 (P-1), passed by learned Duty Magistrate (JMIC), Gurugram and FIR No.0002 dated 03.01.2022, under Sections 120-B, 406, 409, 420, 467, 468 & 471 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860, registered at Police Station Gurgaon City, District Gurugram along with all consequential proceedings arising therefrom.

(2) Learned Senior Counsel on instructions submits that in view of the Cancellation Report (P-17), present petition be disposed off as having been rendered infructuous.

(3) Ordered accordingly.

(4) Needless to say that complainant would be at liberty to take recourse to the legal remedy, including Protest Petition, if so advised.

(5) Learned Senior Counsel for the complainant on instructions submits that in case an adverse order is passed against the petitioner(s) by the Court concerned, no coercive steps shall be taken against them for a period of two weeks from such an order.

(6) Also clarified that in case either of the parties feel(s) aggrieved against the order, to be passed by the Court of competent jurisdiction, legal remedy shall remain open.

(7) Pending application(s), if any, shall also stand disposed off.
