The petitioners have filed the instant petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India seeking directions to respondents No. 2 and 3 to protect their lives and liberty and to restrain the respondents No. 4 and 5 from interfering in their peaceful lives.

Upon notice learned State counsel has appeared and submitted that earlier, complaint was moved by respondents No. 4 and 5 against petitioner No. 1. However, they had compromised the matter and later on complaint was withdrawn. Learned State counsel further contends that the matter has been inquired by the local police station and there is no threat to both the petitioners.

In view of the above, no further orders are required and the petition is, accordingly, dismissed.
