AMAN CHAUDHARY. J.

The present petition has been filed under Section 439 Cr.P.C. for the grant of regular bail to the petitioner in respect of FIR No. 180 dated 31.08.2022 under Sections 307, 323, 341, 506 and 34 IPC (Sections 325, 120-B IPC added later on) registered at Police Station Sadar Dhuri, District Hoshiarpur.

Learned counsel contends that the petitioner has been in custody for the last 4 months and 04 days having been arrested on 12.11.2022. The injury attributed to the petitioner is over the shoulder of the complainant and has been declared simple. Co-accused Harpreet Singh @ Joga who was also attributed simple injury has since been granted regular bail vide order dated 02.02.2023 by this Court, vide Annexure P-2, while co-accused Gagandeep Singh has been granted interim anticipatory bail on 29.11.2022 by this Court vide Annexure P-3. Though, challan has been presented on 29.12.2022, charges are yet to be framed and in all, there are 26 prosecution witnesses. He is not involved in any other case.

Learned State counsel opposes the bail on the ground that he was involved in commission of crime in which injury was caused by him to the complainant. However, he is unable to controvert the other submissions with regard to custody, stage of the trial and the petitioner being not involved in any other case.

Heard.

In view of the facts and circumstances of the case, in particular that the petitioner has been in custody for the last 4 months 04 days. Co-accused have been granted the concession of bail. Though, challan has been presented, charges are yet to be framed and in all, there are 26 prosecution witnesses; the trial is likely to take a considerable time, his further detention behind bars would not serve any useful purpose, thus the present petition for grant of regular bail deserves to be allowed.

As a result, the present petition is allowed. The petitioner is ordered to be released on regular bail, subject to his furnishing bail/surety bonds to the satisfaction of trial Court/Duty Magistrate concerned and subject to him not being required in any other case. The petitioner shall abide by the following conditions:-

1. The petitioner will not tamper with the evidence during the trial.
2. The petitioner will not pressurize/ intimidate the prosecution witnesses.
3. The petitioner will appear before the trial Court on each and every date fixed, unless is exempted by a specific order of Court.
4. The petitioner shall not commit an offence similar to the offence of which, he is an accused, or for commission of which he is suspected of.
5. The petitioner shall not directly or indirectly coerce, induce, threaten or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the

case so as to dissuade him/ her from disclosing such facts to the Court or to any police officer or tamper with the evidence in any manner.

- 6. The petitioner shall not in any manner misuse his liberty.
- 7. The petitioner shall furnish his address and mobile number to the Trial Court forthwith and shall not change the same till the conclusion of the trial and in case for any reason, the petitioner seeks to change any of the aforesaid, the same shall be done only with prior intimation to the learned Trial Court, stating the reason for the same.
- 8. The petitioner shall deposit his passport, if any, with the Trial Court forthwith and in case, he does not have the passport, he shall furnish a specific affidavit in this regard.

It is made clear that in case of any infraction of any of the aforesaid conditions, the State shall be at liberty to seek cancellation of bail as granted to the petitioner by this order.

In view of the above, this Court makes it clarified that the observations made herein above are limited for the purpose of present proceedings and would not be construed as any opinion on the merits of the case and the trial would proceed independently of the aforesaid observations.
