DEEPAK GUPTA, J.

The petitioner is seeking regular bail by way of this petition under Section 439 Cr.P.C in case FIR No.532 dated 27.12.2022 registered under Section 25 of Arms Act, 1959 registered at Police Station City Faridkot, District Faridkot.

As per the allegations, borne out from the impugned order dated 17.02.2023 (Annexure P-1), one country made pistol of .32 bore along with two live cartridges were recovered from the petitioner and co-accused Harveer Singh. Petitioner could not produce any license to keep the pistol.

It is contended by learned counsel for the petitioner that co-accused Harveer Singh has already allowed bail by this Court on 03.02.2023 in CRM-M-4750-2023 and so, petitioner deserves bail on the basis of parity.

Notice of motion.

Mr. Parneet Singh Pandher, AAG, Punjab, accepts notice on behalf of respondent -State.

Custody certificate has been placed on record by learned State

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counsel revealing that petitioner is in custody for the last 2 months 20 days and has no criminal antecedents. Co-accused had already been allowed bail by this Court on 03.02.2023. The case of the petitioner is on parity.

Having regard to the aforesaid facts and circumstances but without commenting anything on the merits of the case, petitioner is admitted to bail on his furnishing bail bonds/surety bonds to the satisfaction of the Learned Trial Court/Duty Magistrate concerned, on usual terms and conditions.
