1. While issuing notice of motion on 24.07.2023, following order was passed:-

“These petitions have been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. for quashing the order dated 30.11.2018 (Annexure P-2) whereby the petitioner has been declared as Proclaimed Offender and FIR No. 20 dated 27.12.2017 registered for the offences punishable under Sections 420 and 406 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 at Police Station NRI, District SAS Nagar.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the matter already stands compromised between the parties vide compromise deed dated 21.12.2018 placed on record as Annexure P-3.

Notice of motion.

Mr. Tarun Aggarwal, Senior DAG., Punjab, who is present in Court accepts notice on behalf of the State.

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Mr. Karan Nehra, and Mr. Abhay Josan, Advocates have put in appearance on behalf of respondent No.2. He files his Memorandum of Appearance. The same is taken on record.

The petitioner is granted liberty to surrender before the trial Court. In case, the petitioner appears before the trial court on or before 27.07.2023 and files an application seeking admission on bail, this Court is quite sanguine that the same will be adjudicated by the trial court on the same day in accordance with law subject to payment of costs of Rs.10,000/- to be paid to the Lawyers Welfare Fund, SAS Nagar, Mohali.

To come up on 24.08.2023.

A photocopy of this order be placed on file of other connected case.”

- 2. Today, counsel for the petitioner has produced order dated 27.07.2023 to demonstrate that the petitioner appeared before the trial Court and was ordered to be admitted to bail.
- 3. In view of above, the interim order dated 24.07.2023 passed by this Court is made absolute, subject to the conditions that the petitioner shall continue to appear before the trial Court.
- 4. Consequently, the present petition stands disposed off.
