The petitioner/applicant has moved an application with a prayer to implead the Union of India as party respondent No. 8 for the proper adjudication of the matter.

Since, as per the learned Advocate General, Punjab, the alleged *detenue* Amritpal Singh has been arrested on 23.04.2023, there is no need to implead the Union of India as a respondent in the present petition and the application is accordingly dismissed.

CRWP 2757 of 2023

The petitioner has moved the present petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ in the nature of *Habeas Corpus* for directing the respondents No. 2 to 7 to produce the

alleged *detenue* Amritpal Singh son of Tarsem Singh, who was allegedly detained by respondents No. 2 to 7 without any authority of law.

Learned Advocate General Punjab assisted by Mr. Aman Pal, Addl. A.G., Punjab, submits that the alleged *detenue* Amritpal Singh has been arrested on 23.04.2023 by following due process of law.

In view of the statement made by the learned Advocate General, Punjab, the petition has been rendered infructuous and is dismissed as such.
