[1] Pursuant to order dated 08.02.2023, learned Mediator has
filed settlement-agreement/compromise dated 02.03.2023 entered into
between the petitioner and respondent No.1 aged 89 and 91 years
respectively. The same is taken on record.

[2] Mr. Mohan Gupta (respondent No.1) is present in Court
along with his counsel Mr. Rajeev Anand, Advocate as also Ms. Swati
Gupta wife of Sh. Manish Gupta, stated by Mr. Rajeev Anand, Advocate
to be daughter-in-law of respondent No.1.

[3] During hearing, on query with regard to amicable settlement

of the dispute before the learned Mediator, Mr. Mohan Gupta (respondent No.1) expressed certain misgivings with regard to his married life over the past 70 years but concluded by stating that although he had faced an unpleasant married life for 70 years, yet he had full love and affection for the children and in the circumstances, he had agreed to the compromise as referred to above.

[4] Adjourned to 18.03.2023.

[5] Interim order to continue, in the meantime, till the next date.

[6] At this stage, Mr. Mohan Gupta (respondent No.1) requests for a quietus to be given to the matter by accepting the settlement-agreement/compromise dated 02.03.2023 entered into between the parties before the Mediation and Conciliation Centre attached to this Court.

[7] The parties i.e. petitioner, Smt. Bimla Gupta wife of Sh. Mohan Gupta as well as respondent No. 1 i.e. Sh. Mohan Gupta s/o Late Sh. Kundan Lal Gupta aged 89 and 91 years respectively as well as their learned counsel state that the settlement-agreement / compromise dated 02.03.2023 has been arrived at out of the earnest desire and free will of the parties, therefore is acceptable to them. Apart from the settlement-agreement/compromise dated 02.03.2023 having been signed by the parties, the same bears the signatures of Sh. Mandeep Gupta, grandson of the parties, Ms. Arumita Gupta wife of Sh. Mandeep Gupta, Mr. Rose Gupta, Advocate for the petitioner, Ms. Swati Gupta wife of Mr. Manish Gupta (claimed to be daughter-in-law of Sh. Mohan Gupta –respondent No.1), and Sh. Rajeev Anand, Advocate for respondent No.1. The parties as well as their counsel pray that the instant petition be disposed of in the light of compromise / settlement between the parties dated 02.03.2023

this court.

[8] In view of the position noted above, the instant petition is disposed of in terms of compromise / settlement dated 02.03.2023 entered into between the parties before the mediation and conciliation centre attached to this court. Contents of the compromise - settlement dated 02.03.2023 be read as an integral part of this order. Parties are directed to ensure adherence to the terms and conditions of the compromise settlement dated 02.03.2023, in time bound manner as indicated therein.

[8] Civil revision petition stands disposed of in the aforementioned terms.
