HARINDER SINGH SIDHU, J.

Present criminal writ petition has been filed under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India seeking directions to respondents to extend the parole of the petitioner for 06 weeks as the mother of the petitioner is seriously ill and bed ridden.

The petitioner has been convicted in case FIR No. 43 dated 23.04.2010 under Section 302 read with Section 34 IPC and Sections 25 and 27 of Arms Act 1959 and sentenced to undergo rigorous imprisonment for life. The Criminal appeal bearing No.CRA-D-163-DB-2016 against the conviction is pending in this Court.

The petitioner was released on parole with effect from 30.01.2023 and is due to surrender on 28.03.2023. It is stated that the mother of petitioner is suffering from an old fracture of the hip. She is bed ridden and is unable to walk and she cannot perform daily chores

on her own. She needs assistance of some member of her family to take care of. It is stated that the brothers of petitioner have already died and there is no one in the family to take care of his mother.

The factum that the mother of the petitioner is bedridden and is unable to look after herself has also been affirmed by the respondent/State.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that the case for premature release of the petitioner is under consideration of the Government.

Taking into account the aforesaid facts, the parole of the petitioner is extended till 06.04.2023.

The petitioner is directed to surrender before the jail authorities concerned on 06.04.2023 well before 5:00 p.m.
