JASJIT SINGH BEDI, J. (ORAL)

On 29.03.2023, the following order was passed:-

“The prayer in the petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C. is for quashing of the order dated 19.01.2015 passed by the Judicial Magistrate 1st Class, Hoshiarpur, whereby the petitioner was declared a 'proclaimed person' in a case arising out of private complaint No. 07/2011 dated 17.02.2011/09.03.2011 under Sections 323, 324, 326 read with Section 34 of the IPC, 1860.

The learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the occurrence pertains to the year 2010. The summoning order came to be passed on 16.08.2012. However, the petitioner had left India on 22.09.2012. In the meantime, the co-accused of the petitioner faced trial and have been acquitted. He states that he is ready and willing to join the proceedings.

Ms. Ramta Chaudhary, D.A.G, Punjab accepts notice on behalf of the respondent-State.

In the meanwhile, the petitioner is directed to surrender before the trial Court within a period of one week from today and subject to deposit of Rs.2 lakhs as costs with the Chandi Kusht Ashram Society, Shiv Ram

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Mandir (Leprosy Colony), Sector 47, Opp. 3 BRD Gate, Chandigarh and deposit of his passport, he shall be released on interim bail to its satisfaction by the trial Court.”

In pursuance to the aforementioned order, the petitioner has surrendered as per orders dated 03.04.2023 and has since been admitted to bail. The copy of the said order are marked as **X & Y**.

In view of the above, no further orders are required to be passed by this Court.

It is expected that the petitioner shall not absent himself from Trial without sufficient cause.

However, as the co-accused already stands acquitted, the Trial Court is directed to conclude the Trial against the petitioner within a period of three months from the next date fixed before it.
