MANOJ BAJAJ, J.

By means of this writ petition filed under Article 226 Constitution of India petitioner has prayed for issuance of a writ in the nature of certiorari for quashing the order dated 14.07.2016 (Annexure P-2) passed by respondent No.2, whereby he was terminated from the service, and for quashing of the order dated 18.10.2016 (Annexure P-3), whereby his request for rejoining the services was kept in abeyance, as his appeal against conviction was pending. Further, prayer is for issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus by directing the respondent Nos.2 and 3 to reinstate the petitioner in service.

During the course of hearing, it is not disputed by learned counsel for the petitioner that against the order dated 14.07.2016 dismissing the petitioner from service based on his conviction in a criminal case, he submitted a request before the Deputy Director General of Police, Range CRPF, Sonapat, Haryana, requesting for rejoining the service, however, the said request was deferred to await the result of the pending criminal appeal and it was further informed that in case the decision by the Court is in his favour his request to

rejoin the service would be considered. Concededly, the order dated 14.07.2016 dismissing the petitioner from service is still operative.

At this stage, Mr. Nilesh Bhardwaj, learned counsel for the petitioner does not press this petition in order to take steps to revive his request/appeal pending before the Deputy Director General of Police, Range CRPF, Sonapat, Haryana.

Dismissed as withdrawn.
