MANJARI NEHRU KAUL, J. (ORAL)

1. The instant petition is for quashing of FIR No.0063 dated 06.05.2020 under Sections 279/337/338 of the IPC (Section 181 of the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988 added lateron) registered at Police Station Amlo, District Fatehgarh Sahib, and all consequential proceedings arising out of the same including challan (Annexure P-2), on the basis of compromise dated 15.03.2023 (Annexure P-3) arrived at, between the parties.

2. Vide order dated 12.04.2023 of this Court, the parties were directed to appear before the learned Trial Court/Illaq Magistrate on 12.05.2023 to get their statements recorded regarding the compromise arrived at, between them.

3. Report has since been received from learned Civil Judge (Jr. Divn.)-cum-Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, Amloh, in pursuance of

the directions of this Court, wherein, the factum of the compromise arrived at between the parties stands verified and confirmed. As per the report compromise has indeed been effected between the parties and the same is without any pressure or coercion and out of their free will and the complainant has also made statement to the effect that he would have no objection if the FIR *qua* the accused-petitioner is quashed.

4. The Trial Court has annexed copies of statements of the parties alongwith its report.

5. Learned State counsel too submits that there are no other accused other than the petitioner and respondent No.2 is the only aggrieved person in the FIR in question.

6. In view of the report of the learned Civil Judge (Jr. Divn.)-cum-Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, Amloh and the principles laid down by the Apex Court in *Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab and others (2012) 10 SCC 303*, and also by the Full Bench of this Court in *Kulwinder Singh and others Vs. State of Punjab and another, 2007(3) RCR (Criminal) 1052*, the instant petition is allowed. The aforesaid FIR and all consequential proceedings arising out of it, are quashed.

7. Needless to say the parties shall remain bound by the terms of compromise and their statements recorded before the Court below.
