The present petition has been filed by the husband of the deceased for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.0053 dated 22.06.2022 under Sections 304-B, 34 of IPC, registered at Police Station Jhunir District Mansa.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has vehemently argued and relied upon the testimony of the complainant as well as the father of the deceased. He further submits that there was matrimonial discord between the parties, but there was never any harassment or beatings or any other demand of dowry raised by the petitioner, as had been recorded in the FIR.

Learned State counsel has vehemently opposed the bail to the petitioner on the ground that there is clear cut medical evidence of

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poisoning of the deceased and, therefore, the husband, who was responsible for the well being of the wife has not been able to do the same.

Heard the learned counsel for the parties.

Although the concession of regular bail has been granted to the father of the petitioner, but the petitioner does not deserve the parity, for the reason that it was the petitioner-husband who was responsible for life and safety of the deceased-wife and it was his duty to have made a congenial atmosphere, but he has failed to do so.

Accordingly, finding no merit in the present petition, the same is dismissed.

However, nothing stated above shall be construed as a final expression of opinion on the merits of the case.
