N.S.SHEKHAWAT, J. (Oral)

1. The petitioner had filed the instant petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C. for quashing of the FIR No. 43 dated 16.03.2016 registered under Sections 420/120-B IPC, Police Station Morinda, District Ropar (Annexure P-1) on the basis of compromise dated 27.03.2019 (Annexure P-2) qua the petitioner. A further prayer was also made to quash the order dated 13.07.2028 (Annexure P-3) passed by the learned Judicial Magistrate 1st Class, Rupnagar, whereby, the present petitioner was declared as *proclaimed offender*.

2. Vide order dated 03.04.2019, the notice of motion was issued by this Court. Again on 22.05.2019, the parties were directed to be present before the learned Chief Judicial Magistrate/Illaq Magistrate on 10.07.2019

or any other date convenient to the Court for recording their statements with regard to the compromise and the learned Court was directed to sent a report alongwith the statements. However, in compliance of the said order, the parties did not appear before the learned Court below. Thereafter, the matter was taken up on 06.01.2020, 23.09.2021 and 22.12.2021. On 22.12.2021, last opportunity was granted to the petitioner to settle the matter.

3. Today, the case has been taken up for hearing and the learned counsel for the petitioner contends that he has no instructions in the matter. It seems that the petitioner is not interested in pursuing the matter any further and, as a consequence, the petition stands dismissed.
