1. Present application has been filed under Section 151 CPC seeking permission to withdraw the main writ petition with liberty to file afresh.

2. Learned counsel for the applicant-petitioner has submitted that the main writ petition was filed by the applicant-petitioner under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ, order or direction especially in the nature of certiorari quashing the impugned action of respondents, vide which the respondents are not fixing the lien/seniority of the petitioner in HAP Madhuban. It is stated that the applicant-petitioner wishes to withdraw the main writ petition on account of clerical mistakes, which is listed for hearing on 17.01.2024 and has thus, prayed that the same be preponed to today.

3. Notice in the application.

4. On advance notice, Ms. Rajni Gupta, Additional Advocate General, Haryana, accepts notice on behalf of the respondents and has stated that the respondents-State have no objection to the said course of action.

5. For the reasons mentioned in the present application, which is duly supported by an affidavit, the same is allowed and the main case is preponed from 17.01.2024 to today itself and the applicant-petitioner is permitted to withdraw the present writ petition with liberty to file a fresh writ petition after giving full and better particulars and after removing the errors in the petition.

6. In view of the above, the main writ petition is dismissed as withdrawn, with the aforesaid liberty.
