Notice of the application.

Mr. C.L.Pawar, Addl. AG, Punjab accepts notice on behalf of
the State and pleads no objection if the same is allowed.

Accordingly, the application is allowed and the main case is
taken on board today itself.

Main case

Prayer in this petition is for quashing of FIR No.15 dated
24.2.2021 registered under Sections 307, 324, 323, 336, 148, 149 IPC
(Section 326 IPC added later on) and Section 27 of Arms Act at Police
Station Tarsikka, District Amritsar on the basis of compromise.

The above stated FIR was registered on the statement of the
complainant/respondent No.2-Satwant Singh against the petitioners.

On notice of motion, respondents No.2 to 4 appeared in the Court through their counsel and pleaded that they have no objection if the FIR in this case is quashed on the basis of the aforesaid compromise which has been effected between the parties.

During the course of preliminary hearing, the trial Court/Illaq Magistrate was directed to record the statements of the all the concerned parties with regard to genuineness and validity or otherwise of the aforesaid compromise.

In compliance thereof, report from the Court of Judicial Magistrate, 1st Class, Baba Bakal Sahib along with statements of the parties has been received, in which, it is mentioned that the compromise is genuine and there was no undue influence or coercion from any side.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties.

Learned counsel for the petitioners and for respondents No.2 to 4 are *ad idem* that in view of the settlement effected between the parties, the present petition deserves to be accepted. It has also come on record that the aforesaid compromise is genuine and the parties effected the same without any undue influence or coercion.

In view of above, nothing remains to be adjudicated further in the present case. Thus, continuation of the criminal proceedings between the parties would be a futile exercise and sheer wastage of time of the Court and thus, amount to abuse of process of law.

For the reasons aforesaid and having regard to the law laid down by Hon'ble Apex Court in **Gian Singh v. State of Punjab and another**, 2012 (4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and Five Judges Bench of this Court

in **Kulwinder Singh and others v. State of Punjab and another**, 2007(3) RCR (Criminal) 1052, this petition is allowed and FIR No.15 dated 24.2.2021 registered under Sections 307, 324, 323, 336, 148, 149 IPC (Section 326 IPC added later on) and Section 27 of Arms Act at Police Station Tarsikka, District Amritsar and all the subsequent proceedings are hereby quashed qua the petitioners.
