SANDEEP MOUDGIL, J (ORAL)

This is a second petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C., read with Section 439 Cr.P.C., for grant of interim bail to the petitioner for two months in FIR No.0171 dated 07.10.2022, under Sections 22, 29 of NDPS Act, 1985, registered at Police Station City Nawanshahar, District SBS Nagar.

This Court is oblivious of the fact that earlier the petitioner got bail for attending the bhog and last ceremonies of her deceased father from 01.04.2023 to 03.04.2023 and today after ten days, he has moved the instant petition supported by a OPD slip issued by Punjab Health System Corporation dated 03.04.2023 (Annexure P-3), which suggests for an operation as soon as possible of the Gall Bladder (cholecyst).

Learned counsel for the petitioner could not make out any case on merits, except on mercy, he is praying for concession of interim bail for two months, wherein the petitioner was involved in commercial quantity of NDPS

contraband and is facing trial.

Looking at the nature of ailment being faced by the petitioner, there is no reason for this Court to grant interim bail at this stage as there are sufficient arrangements for getting such medical treatment and immediate attention to the accused, who are behind the bars during the pendency of trial proceedings as well.

Notice of motion.

On the asking of Court, Mr. Rajiv Verma, DAG, Punjab, accepts notice on behalf of respondent-State, who is requested to ensure that Jail Superintendent shall take all appropriate steps without any delay to get the needful done for the petitioner, as has been advised by the doctor mentioned in the Punjab Health System Corporation OPD Slip, which the petitioner otherwise seems to have got prepared on 03.04.2023 on the day, when she surrendered after utilising the first interim bail of three days.

Be that as it may without going further into any controversy, it would be fittest of thing and this Court would appreciate that immediate effective steps will be taken to ensure all account of medical help, the petitioner requires.

In view of the aforesaid terms, petition stands disposed of.
