The present petition has been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C praying for quashing of orders dated 16.2.2023 passed by learned JMIC, Mukerian, whereby learned court has dismissed the objections filed by the petitioner and directed him to pay an amount of Rs.1,67,000/- instead of Rs.83,500/- and conditional warrants of petitioner have also been issued in complaint case no.17/2004 filed under section 138 of N.I Act.

Having argued the matter at some length, learned counsel for the petitioner prays for withdrawal of the present petition with liberty to the petitioner to avail the alternate remedies as may be available to him in accordance with law before the learned Revisional Court. Counsel also prays for some protection to the petitioner to avail the remedies in accordance with law.

In view of the above position, present petition is disposed of with liberty to the petitioner to approach the court concerned and file an appropriate petition for redressal of his grievances, within a period of 10 days from today. In case the petitioner does so he would have a protection from the conditional warrants issued against him for a period of 10 days

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from today. Needless to say that if the petitioner fails to file petition for the redressal of his grievances within the given period, this order would be of no avail to him.
