Challenge in all the writ petitions i.e., CWP-7507-2023, CWP-7512-2023, CWP-7513-2023, CWP-7516-2023, CWP-7520-2023 and CWP-7529-2023 is to the order / notice dated 10.04.2023 (Annexure P-6) issued by respondent no.2 whereby the allotment / lease in favour of the petitioners with respect to the various shops has been cancelled.

Learned State counsel for respondents no.1 to 4 has submitted that as per his instructions, a fresh notice has been issued to the petitioners on 11.04.2023 and the petitioners have been asked to appear and satisfy that

they have not sub let the premises and it is after hearing the petitioners, a final order with respect to shops in question would be passed. It is further submitted that till the time, the said order is passed, no coercive action would be taken against the petitioners.

Learned counsel for the petitioners has submitted that in view of the statement made by learned State counsel, the present petitions have been rendered infructuous. It is prayed that State be bound by his statement made in the Court.

Keeping in view the above said facts and circumstances, the present petitions are disposed of as having been rendered infructuous. The State would be bound by his statement made before this Court.

The question as to whether the writ petitions against the eviction orders passed with respect to shops owned by Mandir Shree Kala Devi Ji, Patiala / Shri Raj Rajeshwari Devi Ji, Patiala temple, are maintainable or not, is kept open.
