MANJARI NEHRU KAUL, J. (ORAL)

The petitioners are praying for issuance of directions to the official respondents to take appropriate legal action against the private respondents under the provisions of law in pursuance of their representations (Annexure P-2).

Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioners inter alia contends that it is evident that the private respondents are trying to cheat the petitioners of their hard earned money; respondents No.4 and 5 have with an ulterior motive entered into an Agreement to Sell with respondents No.6 to 8. But the police has failed to initiate any action on their complaint (Annexure P-2) dated 22.09.2017 by erroneously concluding that it was an inter-se civil dispute between the parties.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties and perused the relevant material on record.

No ground is made out for issuance of such directions, as prayed for by the petitioners. However, the petition stands disposed of with liberty to the petitioners to avail of their alternative remedy in accordance with law.
