The instant application has been filed under Section 151 CPC for placing on record the orders dated 13.06.2023 and 21.06.2023 as Annexures R-1 and R-2.

For the reasons mentioned in the application, same is allowed and orders dated 13.06.2023 and 21.06.2023 are taken on record as Annexures R-1 and R-2 subject to all just exceptions.

Main case

Petitioner has filed this writ petition under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ in the nature of certiorari for setting aside the order dated 28.02.2022 (Annexure P-7), whereby his payment of pension, gratuity, provident fund, leave encashment and other retiral benefits

were withheld.

Learned counsel for the respondents submits that vide order dated 21.06.2023 (Annexure R-2), respondents have decided to release the entire benefits to the petitioner subject to receipt of “No Outstanding Certificate”.

Faced with this, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that he is ready to furnish the “No Outstanding Certificate” within a period of one week.

In view of the above, without adverting to the merits of the case, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to petitioner to furnish the “No Outstanding Certificate” within a period of one week and after receiving the same, respondents are directed to release all the retiral benefits within a period of two weeks thereafter.
