AUGUSTINE GEORGE MASIH, J. (ORAL)

On considering the submissions made by the learned counsel for the parties, what transpires is that the grievances as have been made with regard to the amount charged for regularization of the allotment, petitioners intend to get the basis which was made the ground for making the said claim apart from the aspect that GST, as has been charged, could not be so charged, as it was not applicable at the relevant time.

Counsel for the petitioners states that the petitioners would file a detailed/comprehensive representation within a period of 15 days from today to the Chairman, Chandigarh Housing Board – respondent No.1, which may be considered and a decision taken thereon within some specified time.

Without going into merits of the case or commenting thereon, we dispose of the present writ petition with liberty to the petitioners as prayed for. In case the said representation is submitted within a period of 15 days

from today, the same shall be considered and a decision taken by the Chairman, Chandigarh Housing Board – respondent No.1 within a period of two months of submission of such representation. Decision so taken be conveyed to the petitioners forthwith.

In case the claim of the petitioners is accepted, the consequential benefits be released to them within a further period of six weeks.
