JAGMOHAN BANSAL, J. (ORAL)

1. The petitioner through instant petition under Section 439 of Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 (for short 'Cr.P.C.') is seeking concession of regular bail in FIR No.2 dated 02.01.2023 under Sections 363 & 366 of Indian Penal Code, 1860 (for short 'IPC') registered at Police Station Nurpur Bedi, District Rupnagar.

2. Mr. Aman Kumar, Advocate appeared and filed his Memorandum of Appearance on behalf of the complainant. The same is taken on record. Registry is directed to tag at an appropriate place.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner *inter alia* contends that petitioner and complainant have arrived at compromise. They have amicably settled their all grievances. The petitioner has filed CRM-M-8918-2023 before this Court seeking quashing of FIR on the basis of compromise.

4. This Court vide order dated 21.03.2023 directed the parties to appear before the Trial Court and tender their statements in support of the compromise. The parties, in compliance of aforesaid order, appeared before the Trial Court on 12.04.2023 and tendered their statements.
5. Learned counsel for the complainant submits that it is factually correct that parties have appeared before the Trial Court on 12.04.2023 and tendered their statements in support of their compromise. He further submits that complainant has no objection if petitioner is released on regular bail.
6. Learned State counsel does not dispute the afore-stated factual position.
7. In view of compromise arrived at between the parties and statements recorded on 12.04.2023 before the Trial Court, the present petition deserves to be allowed and accordingly allowed. The petitioner is ordered to be released on bail subject to conditions as may be imposed by Trial Court/Illaq/Duty Magistrate concerned.
8. Nothing observed hereinabove shall be construed as expression of opinion of this Court on merits of the case and Trial Court shall proceed without being prejudiced by observations of this Court.
