DEEPAK MANCHANDA J. (ORAL)

The petitioners have approached this Court under Article 226 of the Constitution of India for seeking issuance of directions to respondent Nos. 2 to 3 for protecting their lives and personal liberty from respondent Nos.4 and 5 and further not to take any action on the complaint filed by respondent Nos. 4 and 5.

Learned counsel for the petitioners confines himself to the limited prayer for protection of life and liberty of the petitioners from respondent Nos. 4 and 5 and contends that petitioners are major, are above 20 years of age. In support thereof, copies of Aadhaar Cards pertaining to the petitioners have been appended. The learned counsel for petitioners further contends that they are staying in live-in relationship against the wishes of their parents, and petitioners apprehend threat to their lives and liberty and claim that there is a constant danger of being implicated in a false case. Learned counsel for the petitioners further submits that a representation dated 25.04.2023 (Annexure P-3) has also been sent by the petitioners to the respondent No. 2-Commissioner of Police, Ludhiana and the same has not been decided till date and petitioners would be satisfied if the said representation is decided in a time bound manner.

Notice of motion restricted to respondents No.1 to 3 only.

Pursuant to supply of advance copy, Mr. P.S. Grewal, DAG Punjab, accepts notice on behalf of respondents No.1 to 3 and has no objection if appropriate directions are given for deciding the representation submitted by the petitioners.

Therefore, without examining the question of legality and validity of the relationship and expressing any opinion thereon, the petition is disposed of with directions to respondent No.2-Commissioner of Police, Ludhiana, to look into the grievances of the petitioners as set out in the petition and also expressed in the representation (Annexure P-3) and take appropriate action for protection of their lives and liberty as may be warranted by the circumstances in accordance with law and dispose of the representation (Annexure P-3) within a period of one week from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

The Registry is directed to send a copy of this order along with copy of the petition to respondent No.2- Commissioner of Police, Ludhiana, for requisite compliance.
