MAHABIR SINGH SINDHU, J.

Present petition has been filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India read with Haryana Good Conduct Prisoners (Temporary Release) Act, 1988 for extension of parole for further four weeks i.e. from 01.05.2023 to 31.05.2023 in a case bearing FIR No.99 dated 14.07.2016, under Sections 21(b), 21(c), 22(a), 22(c) and 29 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985, registered at Police Station Ismailabad, District Kurukshetra.

(2) The co-ordinate Bench, while issuing notice of motion on 02.05.2023, extended parole in the following manner:-

“Notice of motion for 28.05.2023.

Ms. Tanisha Peshawaria, DAG, Haryana accepts notice on behalf of respondents.

The instant writ petition is filed by the petitioner seeking for extension of parole granted to the petitioner from 31.03.2023 to 01.05.2023 on the ground that his wife is suffering from ovarian cancer third stage and she is under treatment from PGI, Chandigarh.

Previously, in CRWP-951-2023 this Court had granted the concession of parole.

Temporary release under the Haryana Good Conduct Prisoners (Temporary Release) Act, 1988, for a period of four weeks starting from 31.03.2023 to 01.05.2023 directing the petitioner to surrender himself at the Central Jail, Ambala by 5.00 PM on 01.05.2023.

This writ petition had been moved much before the expiry of the said date but is listed on today.

After hearing both sides, we are of the opinion that concession of parole granted earlier is required to be extended till 28.05.2023 to enable the petitioner to attend his wife who is suffering from ovarian cancer, third stage, and is undergoing treatment in PGI, Chandigarh.

Accordingly, pending further orders, the parole granted to the petitioner till 01.05.2023 is extended till 28.05.2023 for the aforesaid reasons.”

(3) Thereafter, petitioner moved an application bearing CRM-W-749-2023 seeking further extension and notice of the same was issued for 07.06.2023.

(4) On the adjourned date i.e. 07.06.2023, the Co-ordinate Bench passed the following order:-

“Medical status/verification report filed by learned State counsel is taken on record.

It has been contended by counsel for the petitioner that though the petitioner was granted parole on account of his wife suffering from Cancer, however, he has already surrendered before the jail

authorities. She submits that as per the medical information, wife of the petitioner needs further surgery.

Let the State file latest status report on or before the next date of hearing.

List on 12.06.2023.”

(5) Today, after arguing for some time, when the Bench is not inclined to accept the prayer, learned Counsel for the petitioner does not press the petition any further.

Disposed off accordingly.

Pending application(s), if any, shall also stand disposed off.
