MAHABIR SINGH SINDHU, J.

Present petition has been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. for quashing of FIR No.16 dated 10.02.2023 (P-1), under Section 406 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860, registered at Police Station, Sadar, District Tarn Taran along with all consequential proceedings arising therefrom on the basis of compromise dated 25.02.2023 (P-2), arrived at between the parties i.e. petitioner as well as respondent No.2.

(2) It transpires that the Coordinate Bench while issuing notice of motion on 08.05.2023 passed the following order:-

“This is a petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C. for quashing of FIR No.16, dated 10.02.2023 (Annexure P-1), under Sections 406 of the IPC, 1860 registered at Police Station Sadar, Tarn Taran, District Tarn Taran with all

subsequent proceedings arising therefrom, on the basis of compromise.

Notice of motion.

On the asking of the Court, Mr. Rajiv Verma, DAG, Punjab accepts notice on behalf of respondent No.1-State.

List on 30.05.2023.

In the meantime, the parties are directed to appear before the Illaqa Magistrate/trial Court within a period of two weeks from today, for recording of their statements with regard to the compromise.

The trial Court is directed to submit a report on or before the next date of hearing containing the following information:-

- (i) Number of persons arrayed as accused in the FIR;*
- (ii) Whether any accused is declared as proclaimed offender?*
- (iii) Whether the compromise is genuine, voluntary and without any coercion or undue influence?*
- (iv) Whether the accused persons are involved in any other FIR or not?"*

(3) Despite the aforesaid directions, none appeared on 29.09.2023 on behalf of the petitioner.

(4) Today also, case has been called twice; but no one is coming forward to pursue the matter.

(5) In view of the above, it appears that there is no compromise between the parties.

(6) As a result thereof, this petition is disposed off at this stage.

- (7) However, petitioner would be at liberty to take recourse to the remedy available under law, if an occasion so arises.
- (8) Pending application(s), if any, shall also stand disposed off.
